Our Corporate health and safety policy defines our commitments and applies across all Harsco divisions, subsidiaries, third party businesses, contractors, and visitors.

We are committed to:

- Establishing a culture of ownership and accountability in which everyone is responsible for proactively identifying hazards and implementing suitable controls adopted by Harsco. Committing and contributing to a culture of safety is a condition of employment at Harsco.
- Enabling excellent safety performance from our employees by establishing leading best work practices and providing appropriate resources and training programs.
- Creating a transparent culture by monitoring, measuring, moderating, and communicating our safety performance through audits, engagement observations, corrective measures, and key performance indicators to our employees, customers, and stakeholders.
- Evaluating our processes, programs, and procedures to continuously improve and maintain our safety performance as a pacesetter and industry leader.
- Engaging with stakeholders (both internal and external) and specialists to develop new or modify work practices, systems, and technologies to continue to achieve safety excellence.
